IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Welcome to Summer Camp in Old Ottawa South! We've been working hard all year to plan an amazing summer camp lineup full of fun and adventure. Firehall Camps are developed by experts in the field with decades of experience in children's programming, and delivered by talented and energetic leaders, many of whom were Firehall Campers themselves. With lots of flexibility and choice, summer camp planning is as easy as 1, 2, 3!

3. Head to oldottawasouth.ca/programs to register! Only 50% of the camp fee is due at the time of registration and since we know things can change, refunds are provided - no questions asked - up to 3 weeks before the camp starts.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

To cancel a registration, please email us at info@oldottawasouth.ca or call us at 613-695-6790. Refunds will be processed back to the original form of payment or as an account credit. **Refunds will be provided up to 3 weeks prior to the start date** and subject to a \$25 administrative fee (this fee is waived if the amount is left as an account credit).

Within 3 weeks (21 days) of a program start, refunds will not be issued other than for medical reasons. Documentation may be required.

REGISTRATION & AMILIA ACCOUNT

Camp registration is easy and secure with our Amilia registration software. If you don't have an account, start with your information as the main contact and be sure to include at least one phone number to reach you during the day. Adding alternative and emergency numbers is also recommended. The email address you provide is not only your account log in but will also be used to send you important program information (changes due to weather, things to bring to camp, etc). Once your account is set up, you can add your children to your account. Please make sure their info is complete and correct including date of birth, and allergies.

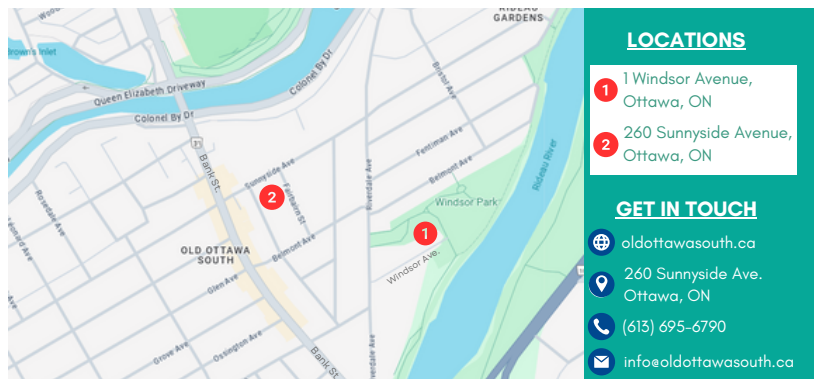
We ask that clients keep their Amilia account up-to-date with current phone numbers, emails, and emergency contacts. You can make changes and add members to your account at any time. If you have forgotten your password, please reach out to the Amilia team for assistance.

PAYMENT

We accept payment by credit card (Mastercard or Visa) and debit. We **do not accept cash** or cheque payments. An account in our registration system (Amilia) is necessary to sign up for all programs and workshops. If you do not have an account with us, you will be prompted to create one when registering either online or in person.

CAMP LOCATIONS

Most of our camps meet at Windsor Park (1 Windsor Ave), which offers a great outdoor setting with a field, wading pool, play structure, tennis and basketball courts, all by the river in the heart of the city. The park provides convenient access to parking, washrooms, and summer tents. Campers will enjoy activities around the city, including out-trips, OCTranspo rides, and walking or biking. After the day's activities, all campers return to the park for pick-up and After-Camp care. Some camps use the Firehall for indoor activities, but most start and finish at Windsor Park. Contact us for late drop-off or early pick-up arrangements.





IMPORTANT INFORMATION

WAIT LISTS

If a program is full, it is recommended to add your name to the wait list. You can add your name to the wait list online or in person and will be prompted to do so whenever a program is full. We do our best to accommodate by adding spaces when available or adding an additional program if possible.

INCLUSION & INTEGRATION

We are dedicated to ensuring that all of our campers enjoy the best experience possible at camp. To do this, we rely on the partnership of parents. Please take the time to make us aware of any medical, behavioural, or cognitive differences (diagnosed or undiagnosed) your child may have at the time of registration or in the weeks leading up to camp. This might include social anxieties, communication barriers, the tendency to run or wander away from the group, simply requiring additional "body breaks" or a little bit of extra attention. Making us aware early on will help our staff to arrange for any additional supports or strategies that will help your child succeed. Please also remember that our programs take place in a public park so the ability to stay with the group and follow instructions is paramount.

EXTENDED DAY CARE

Need to drop off early or pick up late? We have you covered with optional Before-Camp care and/or After-Camp care. There is an additional fee and you can add it on at the time of registration, or at the time of camp. The fee covers the full week and campers will enjoy extra park playtime on the play structure and with quiet activities like crafts and colouring.

FAQS

I have put my child on a waitlist. What is the likelihood that a spot will open up?

Some of our camps will fill early on in the year but we're committed to making sure that there is space for everyone. With registration starting well in advance, we are able to make adjustments and add programs or spaces where there is demand. The waitlists will move and if a spot becomes available we will contact you right away.

Is the full camp fee due at time of registration?

No. You'll have the option to split the payment or pay it in full. 50% of the total registration fee is due at the time of registration, and the outstanding balance will be processed on June 1st with the credit card used for the purchase. After June 1st, the full balance is due at the time of registration.

What happens if my child misplaces belongings at camp?

We first do our best to return the items to you; having each item labelled clearly with your child's first and last name is very helpful. Any items left behind at the end of the day will be kept at the park and put out on display the next day so keep your eyes out for items you recognize. At the end of the summer any items left will be sorted and if labelled, we will contact you to pick it up and if not, will be donated.

My child will require medication while at camp. What should I do?

All prescription medications (including Epi-Pens) must have the drug store label complete with the child's name, doctors's name, dosage, and directions. Medications should be given to the Head Counsellor in the morning, along with a completed Medication Authorization Form. These forms can be found online in the spring, and will be sent by email before camp.

Will the camp continue in the rain?

Yes! A little rain won't stop the fun, So dress for the weather. We will continue outdoor activities as we have large tents for shelter. If weather conditions become dangerous we will move to our in door space at the Firehall, in some cases we may add in a bus trip to a local venue. Parents will be informed as soon as possible of these changes.

Do I need to pack a swimsuit and towel if my child does not want to swim?

Yes, please send their swimsuit every day rain or shine. Many of our activities are best done in swimwear. If they change their mind and want to participate in water play they will be prepared. Towels are also great for sitting under the shade of a tree.

How am contacted if there are changes to my child's camp, such as drop-off in bad weather?

Parents/Guardians will receive both a text message and email if a change to drop off or Pick up location occurs. Since summer weather can change quickly, we keep a close eye and will always contact you in the event of changes as soon as possible. It is important for the account owner to ensure that all contact information is up to date.

THEME CAMPS

Theme camps are designed to tap into your child's sense of adventure and imagination. With exciting activities, special events, and out-trips designed to suit the age and interests of our campers, theme camps offer a perfect balance of outdoor activity, creative crafts, and fun and games. Following a structured traditional day-camp routine, weeks are filled with exciting highlights all designed around a theme for the week. There are three age groups and these camps run every week of the summer.

Fabulous and Four (4yr olds) \$371

Designed specifically for our first-time campers, each day is full of new activities and adventures, with a consistent and familiar daily routine. With plenty of outdoor fun and activities designed around the theme for the week, this small-group camp is the perfect place for little ones to make new friends, stay active, and enjoy the wonders of summer in a safe, welcoming environment. Camp leaders for this group are selected specifically for their experience and aptitude for looking after our youngest campers, many pursuing careers in Early Childhood Education.

Ready to Roam (5 & 6yr olds) \$374

This group is for young campers who are used to the daily school routine, may or may not have been to camp before, and are ready to try new things and meet new friends. Ready to Roam campers will enjoy days filled with outdoor games, creative projects, discovery, and adventure with caring and energetic leaders.

Camp Quest (7-9yr olds) \$379

Each day is packed with outdoor adventures, creative activities, team challenges, and plenty of fun, designed specifically with the social, emotional, and physical needs of 7-9yr olds in mind. In addition to themed activities, there are weekly field trips and guest visits that add even more adventure to the mix. Be sure to check the weekly notes for details on our trips and special guests. Camp leaders for this group are selected specifically for their high energy and talent for captivating the imagination of this age group.

Made in Canada June 30-July 4 (4 days)

Enjoy a day trip to Eco-Odyssée Nature Park to learn about animal scat and all about the wild creatures that leave their mark. Get ready to get dirty and dive into the strange side of nature!

BIKING CAMPS

A great way to explore the city, biking gives campers a sense of independence and freedom. With a focus on road and cycling safety as well as basic bike maintenance, these programs offer a unique and fun way to spend the week. With small groups and experienced leaders, biking camps allow campers the opportunity to feel independent while they participate in planning their routes and destinations. Campers must come prepared with a road-ready bike in good condition and a CSA-approved helmet, bike lock, bell/horn and reflectors. Campers must also be capable of biking independently on two wheels (no training wheels) for up to 10km in a day with breaks.



Out and About (8-10 year olds) \$373

For younger or less experienced cyclists, this program offers shorter routes with destinations at local parks or attractions in and close to Old Ottawa South, Old Ottawa East, and the Glebe. Bike trips will be balanced with other games, activities and crafts.

Nomads (11-15 year olds) \$373

For more experienced cyclists, this program offers longer routes with destinations around the Ottawa-Gatineau area. Destinations can include parks or beaches where the group will take breaks and enjoy some shade.

Bike Overnight Camping (8-10 and 11-15 year olds) \$524

For those ready for next-level adventure, this week includes a bike trip to Wesley-Clover park where the group will set up for two nights of camping adventure. Participants will leave Wednesday with plenty of stops along the way, including a swim at Britannia Beach. The group will be joined by supervisors and other staff with all of the equipment and supplies needed for the camping adventure.

For campers unsure about being away from home, this is the perfect close-to-home program for beginner campers, and a great step for future camping experiences.

Campers can expect to participate in camp cooking, tent set up and take down, general camp skills, outdoor games, water fun, and campfires.

ADVENTURE CAMPS

Adventure camps are designed to tap into your child's sense of discovery and exploration. With exciting activities planned to get some of our older campers out of the neighbourhood, these programs are perfect for experienced campers who have outgrown typical day-camp games in the park, and are ready to explore the city. With a focus on teamwork and friendship, campers will build self-confidence and independence by stepping out of their comfort zone, and trying new things together.

Ultimate Staycation (10-13 year olds)

Become a hometown tourist and enjoy a full week of vacation right here in Ottawa. The week starts with making our own Canada Day shirts and visiting historical sites. There's no camp on Tuesday but the rest of the week will make up for it with visits to some of the top tourist attractions in the city.

White Water Rafting (8-10 and 11-13 year olds)

Spend half the day in the Firehall Pottery Studio with a talented and experienced instructor. Mornings will be spent in the pottery studio, where campers will explore various techniques to create both functional and sculptural projects and will learn about applying underglazes and food-safe glazes. In the afternoons, the park becomes a haven for crafts, games, and water play, providing a perfect balance between artistic expression and outdoor fun. All projects will be fired in the kiln and ready for pick up about a month after camp is done. **Drop off and Pick up at the Firehall, 260 Sunnyside Ave.**

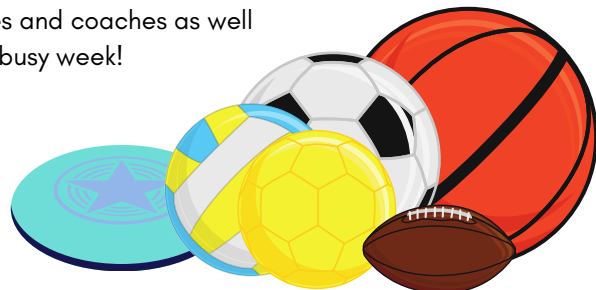
Sports Camps (6–8, and 9–11 years old)

LEADERSHIP CAMPS

Counsellor-in-Training (CIT)

\$529, two weeks

Minimum age of 14 years old as of December 31, 2025 (completion of Grade 8)

Brand new for 2025, this program is designed specifically for young leaders who are ready to take the next step in becoming a camp counselor. With two full weeks of hands-on learning and group activities, participants will complete all of the training and certification necessary to secure employment in summer camps, including Standard First Aid, and HIGH FIVE: Principles of Healthy Child Development. CITs will also receive training in behaviour management, safety and supervision, and inclusion and accessibility. This program includes a two-night overnight camping trip (July 16–18), with opportunity to build on developing leadership and teamwork skills around the campfire. Those who successfully complete the CIT program will be offered a job for the remainder of the summer as a Junior Camp Counselor, and opportunities for employment throughout the school year.

Minimum age of 13 years old as of December 31, 2025 (completion of Grade 7)

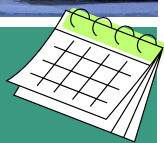
This camp offers a unique opportunity to make a positive impact in the community while developing leadership skills. During the program, participants will engage in hands-on activities such as organizing and running a lemonade stand to raise funds for local charities. They'll also visit important community organizations like the Humane Society and the local food bank, learning about their missions and volunteering to make a difference. These experiences will empower campers to become active, compassionate leaders who understand the importance of giving back and being an active member of the community. With a focus on teamwork, social responsibility, and leadership, this program provides a great transition step out of traditional day-camps.
